

In the remote hills of Guatemala, Michael and Rocky Beene have lived for over 20 years right alongside the villagers, embracing them as their own family. Witnessing starvation and sickness, they began a program that fed over 150 village children, but from one day to the next, the children stopped coming. "Why?" the Beenes asked. Finally one of the children spoke up. 'There's a rumor going around that you're fattening us up to eat us.' NO, the Beenes replied. "We're just trying to help you!" Overcoming many cultural

obstacles, this family has spent 27 years reaching out to people who were on the list of extinction and have been long forgotten by the civilized world. Now, they're back in the United States for a season with a new purpose.

Some may call them courageous. The Beene's just consider themselves a willing vessel.

From the beginning of their journey initially in El Salvador, then Guatemala, these missionaries sought out people groups that were "falling through the cracks." Villagers were dying from the secondary effects of plagues like cholera and measles. When pneumonia and dehydration set in, Michael and Rocky would put the sick on IV's, hydrate them and they would rebound. Medical and dental teams were brought in as well, and as practical needs were met, individual hearts would be open, asking, "Why?" They would say, all of those night as you came out of your huts and looked up into heaven praying, "If there is a God in heaven, please help my children." God sent us to serve you. Upon realizing God was reaching down to them, they turned toward the Gospel in response to His goodness.

"Give them a reason not to kill you, before you try to convert them," was the family motto. As the Beenes were helping villagers, they knew their lives could be in danger. Years after establishing churches, schools, feeding programs

and medical clinics in the villages, they were evangelizing in another Locals area. from the first village came to testify at the next village. They explained they thought how the missionaries were going 'to steal their land and their children, so they dedicated and committed themselves

to defend their village by killing them,' Michael retold. For three years, they plotted to kill the missionaries, but every time they had a plan, God intervened! One of their wives or children would become sick, and they had to go to the missionaries for help as a last resort. After three years, the villagers met and decided maybe we shouldn't kill the missionaries. Maybe these outsiders really want to help. "Rocky and I are listening to this, sweating, thanking God we didn't know you were trying to kill us all that time," he said. These same leaders today are carrying the gospel further into the dense jungle, from village to village.

Miracles have happened all along the way. One sweet

woman was bitten by a deadly snake. Her daughter ran to the Beenes for help. "She wants to talk to you before she dies" the daughter said. They ran to her side and prayed for her. The signs of death were imminent. This woman had been through a lot, previously another daughter had been taken from her by force. "The devil has been hard against me and taken my daughter and now the devil is taking my life too, but I want to stand here and testify to you that no matter what the enemy does to me, I will never ever turn my heart away from Jesus." The effects of the venom went away!. "God restored her life and gave her daughter back," Rocky shared.

Christ Centered Homes

The panel first suggested that newlyweds should establish and maintain a Christ-centered home. Everything rests on that foundation. If a young husband and wife are deeply committed to Jesus Christ, they enjoy enormous advantages over a family with no spiritual dimension.

A meaningful prayer life is essential in maintaining a Christ-centered home. Of course, some people use prayer the way they follow their horoscopes, attempting to manipulate an unidentified "higher power." One of my friends teasingly admits that he utters a prayer each morning on the way to work when he passes the doughnut shop. He knows it is unhealthy to eat the greasy pastries, but he loves them dearly. Therefore, he asks the Lord for permission to indulge himself each day.

He'll say, "If it is Your will that I have a doughnut this morning, let there be a parking space available as I circle the block." If no spot can be found for his car, he circles the block and prays again.

Shirley and I have taken our prayer life a bit more seriously. In fact, this communication between man, woman, and God has been the stabilizing factor throughout our forty-plus years of married life. In good times, in hard times, in moments of anxiety, and in periods of praise, we have shared this wonderful privilege of talking directly to our heavenly Father. What a concept. No appointment is needed to enter into His presence. We don't have to go through His subordinates or bribe His secretaries. He is simply there, whenever we bow before Him. Some of the highlights of my life have occurred in these quiet sessions with the Lord.


At one point, shortly after Danae earned her driver's license, Shirley and I covenanted between us to pray for our son and daughter at the close of each day. Not only were we concerned about the risk of an automobile accident, but we were also aware of so many other dangers that lurk out there in a city like Los Angeles, where we lived at the time. That part of the world is known for its weirdos, ding-alings, and fruitcakes. That's one reason we found ourselves on our knees each evening, asking for divine protection for the teenagers we loved so much.

One night we were particularly tired and collapsed into bed without our benedictory prayer. We were almost asleep before Shirley's voice pierced the night. "Jim," she said. "We haven't prayed for our kids yet today. Don't you think we should talk to the Lord?"

I admit it was very difficult for me to pull my six-foot twoinch frame out of the warm bed that night. Nevertheless, we got on our knees and offered a prayer for our children's safety, placing them in the hands of the Father once more.

Later, we learned that Danae and a girlfriend had gone to a fast-food establishment and bought hamburgers and Cokes. They had driven up the road a few miles and were sitting in the car eating the meal when a city policeman drove by, shining his spotlight in all directions. He was obviously looking for someone, but gradually went past.

A few minutes later, Danae and her friend heard a clunk from under the car. They looked at one another nervously and felt a sharp bump. Before they could leave, a man crawled out from under the car and emerged on the passenger side. He was very hairy and looked like he had FOCUS • PAGE 10

to the door and attempted to open it. Thank God, it was locked. Danae quickly started the car and drove off ... no doubt at record speed.

When we checked the timing of this incident, we realized that Shirley and I had been on our knees at the precise moment of danger. Our prayers were answered. Our daughter and her friend were safe!

It is impossible for me to overstate the need for prayer in the fabric of family life. Not simply as a shield against danger, of course. A personal relationship with Jesus Christ is the cornerstone of marriage, giving meaning and purpose to every dimension of living. Being able to bow in prayer as the day begins or ends gives expression to frustrations and concerns, which might not otherwise be ventilated. On the other end of that prayer line is a loving heavenly Father who has promised to hear and answer our petitions. In this day, when families are disintegrating on every side, we dare not try to make it on our own.

Couples who have not found a common faith are often left in a vulnerable position. One such lady wrote the following letter to me after her husband had left her:

Dear Dr. Dobson:

My husband recently left me after fifteen years of marriage. We had a great physical, emotional, and intellectual relationship, but something was missing ... we had no spiritual bond between us.

Please tell young couples that there will always be a void in their lives together without Christ. A good marriage must have its foundation in Him in order to experience lasting love, peace, and joy.

Since my husband walked out on me, I have tried to rebuild my relationship with God. I am now growing steadily in my walk with the Lord, but I am alone.

There is a great truth in this sad letter. The couple that depends on Scripture for solutions to the stresses of living has a distinct advantage over the family with no faith.



The Bible they love is the world's most incredible text. It was written by thirty-nine authors who spoke three separate languages and lived in a time frame spanning fifteen hundred years. How miraculous is the work of those inspired writers! If two or three individuals today were to witness a bank robbery, they would probably give conflicting accounts of the incident. Human perception is simply that flawed. Yet those thirty-nine contributors to Scripture, most of whom never even met each other, prepared sixty-six separate books that fit together with perfect continuity and symmetry. The entire Old Testament makes a single statement: "Jesus is coming." And the New Testament declares: "Jesus is here!"

By reading these Holy Scriptures, we are given a window into the mind of the Father. What an incredible resource! The creator, who began with nothingness and made beautiful mountains and streams and clouds and cuddly little babies, has elected to give us the inside story of the family. Marriage and parenthood were His ideas, and He tells us in His Word how to live together in peace and harmony. Everything from handling money to sexual attitudes is discussed in Scripture, with each prescription bearing the personal endorsement of the King of the universe. Why would anyone disregard this ultimate resource?

Finally, the Christian way of life lends stability to marriage because its principles and values naturally produce harmony. When put into action, Christian teaching emphasizes giving to others, self-discipline, obedience to divine commandments, conformity to the laws of man, and love and fidelity between husband and wife. It is a shield against addictions to alcohol, pornography, gambling, materialism, and other behaviors that could be damaging to the relationship. Is it any wonder that a Christ-centered relationship is the best ground floor for a marriage?

Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn, that great Soviet dissident, once wrote, "If I were called upon to identify briefly the principal trait of the entire twentieth century, here too I would be unable to find anything more precise and pithy than to repeat once again: Men have forgotten God."

Don't let this happen in your home. You probably knelt together and sent a prayer to the Lord during your wedding ceremony. Return to that source daily for strength and stability. **†**



The Beene's story has a fairytale beginning, love at first sight. It was Rocky's first mission trip as a young woman, beginning in a small town in Guatemala. When she heard about a village that was dying of sickness; she went on a bush plane to help. Rocky was putting rubber shoes on the native children when she looked up and saw a man with a rain poncho riding a mule. "Something stirred in my heart and I said 'God, is this my husband?" Michael got off that mule, and something in his heart stirred. As Rocky walked toward him, he said "that's my wife." Six months later they

were married. They moved back to Guatemala and have raised four children who now range in age from 22 to 10.

Just like the villagers, the Beene family washed their clothes on a rock, cooked over an open fire for the first year and assimilated to the primitive lifestyle of the natives. In bringing up their family, these parents wanted their own children to understand the American culture, too. So, once a year they would all come back. The transition wasn't always easy. As they prayed, "God showed us that (He) can be in the poorest of the poor or in the mansions and palaces," Rocky said. God gave them His eyes for people regardless of environment and a burden for souls no matter the circumstance. "It's amazing how flexible our lives have become to walk in and out of different cultures between prosperity and poverty and have total comfort wherever we are."

For almost three decades, this family has invested in the

people of Guatemala. Churches have been planted, schools built, agriculture programs added and life breathed back into dying villages. Local villagers have taken the reign and become pastors, teachers and farmers. Back on furlough last February, Michael was driving a local highway and he began to be burdened about his own country. The economy, the housing market crash, political scene and stock market were all weighing heavy. In that moment, he knew this was more than a furlough trip. The Lord was calling him home to the United States to share a message.

While concerned about the circumstances, God was telling Michael to look beyond that to spiritual revival. God







There were signs of distress and wear all over her.

I thought of all the people who drive by this boat every day and pay no attention whatsoever. They don't realize that she's a perfect picture of what becomes of people who fall away from the will of God. A beautiful and productive life — happy, peaceful, and full of joy — can turn around



How to Live a Simple Life

Life is complicated these days. And you can see it in even the practical side of daily life. For example, when I was a kid, there was one kind of medicine for sinus problems. You didn't have to think about what to buy or what you would do to treat it; you just used that medicine. As an adult, I remember a time when I stood in the store looking at the various kinds of medicine for about forty-five minutes, trying to decide which one I really needed. Did I want a non-drowsy formula or one that would help me sleep? And which brand should I get?

We call this progress! But in many ways, more choices or more activities or more things just make life harder and actually keep us from enjoying life. We need to learn how to live balanced lives of simplicity.

One definition I found of complication is "to make complex, intricate or bewildering, or to twist." Things that are complicated are often hard to understand and they bewilder or frustrate us. Simple, on the other hand, means "composed of one thing; readily understood or performed." Living simply makes life more enjoyable.

John 10:10 says, "...I came that they may have and enjoy life, and have it in abundance (to the full, till it overflows)" (The Amplified Bible). This scripture makes it clear that God wants us to enjoy our lives. And I have found that simplifying my life in several areas has helped me to be able to enjoy my life each day.

Four Ways to Simplify Your Life

Break up your daily routine by adding a few simple things you enjoy. Take a walk or go for a drive. I like to go get



coffee, or sometimes I ask Dave to take me for a relaxing drive. It's a nice, simple break in my day.

We need to keep prayer simple. A few simple words spoken in faith are more powerful than a million eloquent ones spoken to impress God. I remember a time when God challenged me not to talk so much during my prayer time but instead, ask Him for what I wanted with as few words as possible. I realized that a lot of my faith was based on my ability to talk enough so I sounded eloquent and thought I could convince God to give me what I wanted.

I've learned to keep it simple and just say what I need to say. If I need help, I can pray, "God, I need Your help today and I'm asking You to be with me in this situation." In the beginning it may feel that you're not doing enough, but God will answer as you put your faith in Him, not in how you're praying.

Get the clutter out of your life. Living with lots of clutter creates complication and keeps us from having order. It makes people feel overwhelmed and confused and can be draining. If you have lots of clutter in your home, you may not even know what you have or where to find things when you need them. It's helpful to get rid of things you don't use. Either throw them away or give them to someone you know who can use them.

Stop multitasking! We tend to think of multitasking as a strength, but it's actually more of a hindrance. We need to focus on what we're doing and do one thing at a time. Don't put your makeup on while you're driving or talk on the phone while you're balancing your checkbook. I have really grown in this area and am still learning to give myself completely to the thing I'm doing rather than thinking about what I've been doing or plan to do next. My goal is to enjoy the moment I'm in, and I believe God wants us to slow down and possibly do less with better quality.

It's important to God that we enjoy our lives. We can have the life Jesus died to give us when we focus on Him and choose to simply follow Him. **†**



Deep Dark Water



Buy a house while in student loan debt?

Dear Dave,

I'm 31, single, and I have two college degrees. I have no money to speak of, having just come through a rough patch of unemployment, but I recently landed a job that will pay me \$20,000 to start. There's the added possibility of an increase to \$40,000 in the first year. I'm thinking about buying a house, but I've also got \$50,000 in student loan debt. The good news is that I have no other debt. What are your thoughts on buying a home in this situation?

Dear Trevor,

Man, you're broke! There's no other way to describe being \$50,000 in debt with a job making \$20,000. You don't need to get wrapped up in buying a place right now. At this point, a house would end up being a curse instead of a blessing. You've been through the valley, and now I want you to come up into the sunlight. I want you to start building a future on something solid, and that solid ground means being debt-free. If I woke up in your shoes, I'd get unbelievably aggressive about paying off this debt. I'm talking about rice and beans and living in a cheap little apartment for the next two or three years while you kill it off.

Whatever you do, Trevor, please don't get complacent about this debt. Lots of times, people will play around with student loans. They don't take them seriously, because they have low payments or really low interest rates. The next thing you know, it's still sitting there 10 years later staring at you like some kind of big, dumb pet!

Having a bunch of mortgage payments hanging over your head would completely destroy the foundation of your new financial life. Save up \$1,000 for a small emergency fund. Go crazy about paying off the loan.



You'd be giving her a say in your lives in a different way and at a completely different level than ever before. You just don't need that in your life!

Now, if she wants to make paying off your debt a gift—one that will facilitate you guys hitting the mission field earlier—I'm okay with that. I'd be honored, and I'd accept the gift. But I would never tell you to go into debt—especially to a parent. I'm sure she's coming from the perspective that she'd make a better "creditor" than the credit card company. If it were me, I'd tell her that I love her, but I just don't want to take a chance on doing anything that might come between us later.
